

Make Your Own



Table-top Shuffleboard



Materials

- Craft paper, poster board, cardboard, etc.
- Marker
- Ruler
 - Be sure to make your boxes large enough for your dice to fit inside
 - Make sure your triangles are equal
- Draw checker pieces, washers, coins, etc.
- Masking tape

If you want to use a coin for shooting your dice

- Get crocheted Pipe cleaners & pencils, rings, chopsticks, etc.

Rules:

Each player starts the game. This player will line up their four dice in the right half of the 18 off area (the space between the scoring triangle and the baseline). The front dice should be lined up on the left side. The first player will shoot one die toward the scoring triangle on the opposite end of the shuffleboard court.

Each player takes turns shooting their dice toward the opposite scoring triangle - use your homemade cue or slide with your hands. They may try to both get their die into a point scoring square or they may try to knock their opponent's die out.

Scoring: Once all the dice have been shot, you may score the round. You may only score points for dice that are **completely** in one box, dice may not be touching lines of other boxes. Inside of the "18" box = 18 points, inside of the "1" box = 8 points, inside of the "7" box = 7 points, and inside of the "9" box = minus 10 points. The first person to reach 75 points is declared the winner.



Example: the score at the end of this round would be 7 - 8 black team.
