Make Your Own



Table-top Shuffleboard



Materials:

- Court: paper, poster board, cardboard, etc.
- Marker
- Ruler
 - Be sure to make your boxes large enough for your discs to fit inside
 - o Make sure your triangles are equal
- Discs: checker pieces, washers, coins, etc.
- Masking tape

If you want to use a cue for shooting your discs


 Get creative! Pipe cleaners & pencils, twigs, chopsticks, etc.

Rules:

Red player starts the game. This player will line up their four discs in the right half of the 10-off area (the space between the scoring triangle and the baseline). The black discs should be lined up on the left side. The first player will shoot one disc toward the scoring triangle on the opposite end of the shuffleboard court.

Each player takes turns shooting their discs toward the opposite scoring triangle – use your homemade cue or slide with your hands. They may try to both get their disc into a point-scoring square or they may try to knock their opponent's disc out.

Scoring: Once all the discs have been shot, you may score the round. You may only score points for discs that are **completely** in one box; discs may not be touching lines of other boxes. Inside of the "10" box = 10 points, inside of the "8" box = 8 points, inside of the "7" box = 7 points, and inside of the "-10" box = minus 10 points. The first person to reach 75 points is declared the winner.



Example: the score at the end of this round would be 7 – 0 black team.
